Aerial	A view from above
Beach	An area of sand or stones beside the sea
British Isles	Great Britain, Ireland and all the nearby islands
City	A large town. London is a city
Cliff	A high area of land that is next to the sea
Country	An area of land that is controlled by its own government
Human Features	Features of land that have been impacted by human activity
Island	A piece of land that is completely surrounded by water
Physical features	Natural features of land.
Sea	a large area of salty water that is part of an ocean
Season	the main times of year which can be divided and which have their own typical weather
Tourist	a person who is visiting a place for pleasure and interest
Town	a large group of houses, shops and buildings where people live and work. Towns are larger than villages but smaller than cities. High Wycombe is a town.
United Kingdom	The UK, is officially known as the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. It includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland
Village	a small group of houses, perhaps with a few shops, that are often in the countryside. Downley is a village.
Weather	what the sky and air outside are like, such as cold or sunny.


Geography Skills and Field Work
